The National Numeracy Challenge

Maths can sometimes seem daunting but engaging positively with children's learning can make a big difference to both children's and parents' confidence with numbers. You don't have to be a maths expert to be able to support your children, but improving your own confidence with maths – if you need to – can help you feel more comfortable doing so. We'd like to let you know of an opportunity to learn online with the National Numeracy Challenge.

The Challenge is a free and easy-to-use website that aims to help adults brush up without pressure on the numeracy skills which are needed in work and everyday life. You can find out where your skills are, practise some of the things you find difficult and access online learning resources at the right level for you.
