"I Am Who Exodus 3:14 The whole school theme for this year continues to be 'I Am who I Am'. Our Class theme for this term is 'Choose Courage Over Fear: How will your spirit grow this term?'. Within this, we will be exploring how we can strengthen our faith and be a shining example to others.

In History, Year 1 will be focusing on the Titanic. We will become historians and focus on different sources to

see what we can



discover! We will learn about why the Titanic was so important and what life on board was like in different classes. We will then turn our attention to how the 'unsinkable' Titanic sank and why more

people didn't survive the tragedy.



We will also be focusing on **Clifton** in our Geography learning as we explore our local area. We will learn about how Clifton was developed

and the history of our school and Church.

Our science lessons will focus on Growing Plants. We will carry out investigations on how plants grow and the ideal conditions for germination. We will also continue our work on seasons as we carry out some investigations surrounding the changing weather.

In our D&T sessions, we will be using the vegetables we have grown to become chefs and do some cooking. We will be tasting raw and cooked vegetables and giving our opinions before turning them into soup.

In art, we will be focusing on the work of Stephen Wiltshire. Drawing our own



landscapes and experimenting with painting in watercolour. We will visit Clifton Flower Park and take

inspiration to create our own landscape pictures.

Our English lessons will begin by focusing on the book 'The Day the Crayons Quit'. Where we will work on

writing our own persuasive text. We will then turn our attention to the classic story of 'Jack and the Beanstalk. We will retell the story and then create



our own story inspired by this one. Our non-fiction writing will link to our Geography learning as we write an information text about Clifton.

During weekly computing sessions, we will continue to learn how to stay safe online and continue to develop our typing and word-processing skills.

During our maths learning this term we will be focusing on: Multiplication and **Division. Fractions. Position and Direction, Place Value to 100, Money** and Time. We will also continue our weekly Arithmetic Challenge and daily fluency quizzes to boost our fluency surrounding Addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

Our Becket music teachers will continue to join us as we deepen our learning about beat, rhythm and tempo.

This term is going to be packed full of opportunities and so much exciting learning. We can't wait to get started!



<u>Homework</u>

Homework tasks will be given out every Friday. This will be spellings, number challenge, handwriting or a mini project to complete at home.

Please support your child in these tasks as they will consolidate our learning in the classroom. Spelling tests will take place on Thursdays.

Mathletics and Numbots logins are in your child's reading record, Your child's Numbots login will also give them access to Times table Rock Stars as we will begin using this this term.

Notices:

Uniform - It is school policy that all hair longer than shoulder length must be tied up. Hair bobbles must be discreet and in school colours. No large bows or novelty hair bands please. Year 1 must wear a button down blouse or shirt, with a tie, unless they are wearing a summer dress. Trainers are not allowed; children are expected to wear school appropriate shoes.

Reminder—Mrs Head will teach Year 1 on Mondays.

Reading Books

All children will be given a reading record, phonetically decodable book and library reading book. Please listen to your child read **everyday** and write a comment in their reading record. The library book is one to share and enjoy together. Your child is not expected to read this independently.

Children must bring in their reading books everyday. We have daily guided reading sessions and volunteers who listen to the children read.

Inside each reading record is a list of Year 1 common exception words. These words cannot be decoded using phonics. All children are expected to be able to **read and spell** all of these words by the end of the year. Please refer to this word list regularly in order to help your child learn them.

Reading books will be changed every Tuesday.

<u>PE</u>

PE days will now be Tuesdays and Wednesdays.

<u>Kit:</u> PE kits must be brought into school on Monday, If you take them home to wash, please ensure they come back to school. All earrings and jewellery must be removed for PE lessons. If children are unable to do this independently then please remove them before the school day.

Tuesday– Swimming: Children will need a swimming costume and a towel, packed in a bag that they can carry by themselves.

Following the four swimming sessions Tuesday's PE will focus on Team games and this will be done outside, as the weather gets warmer children may wish to do PE in shorts and Tshirt however children should have appropriate outdoor PE kit in colder weather. (Black leggings or tracksuit bottoms and a black sweatshirt or hoodie.)

Wednesday– Gymnastics: Children should wear white t-shirts and black shorts (no stripes or logos).

Earrings: For health and safety reasons, earrings and all other jewellery **must** be removed before all PE sessions. Please remove them before school if your child is not able to do this independently. Children will not be allowed to swim if they are wearing earrings and they cannot remove them.
